

Final Report on implementation of the Grant Agreement signed on February 17, 2022 between Embassy of Japan in Georgia and Georgian Foundation for Strategic and International Studies.

Implementation of the Grant agreement covered period from February 17, 2022 to November 20, 2023. During the mentioned period GFSIS in cooperation with Japan Embassy organized two public events dedicated to the promotion of then knowledge and awareness about Japan's foreign policy and the possible ways of increase cooperation between Japan and Georgia.

1. 2- day Symposium: Georgia and Japan in the Changing World, 14-15 March, 2022

The two-day conference, held in Tbilisi, Radisson Blue hotel gathered around 70 participants from civil society, academia, experts' community, civil service, embassies and international organizations to discuss following topics:

- Japan's Foreign Policy, FOIP amid changing Global Order, Japan's Foreign Policy Convergence in Georgia
- Georgia's Foreign Policy, international order, human security, democracy and rule of law, Georgia's Foreign Policy Convergence in Japan
- Georgia-Japan business partnership opportunities: exploratory discussion
- Georgia: connectivity function between EU and Japan: "Middle Corridor" and its stakeholders, Transport and Energy projects –mutual partnership opportunities and needs

2. Public Discussion Free and Open Indo-Pacific. November 20, 2023



The public discussion was divided into two sessions, the first one referred to possibilities and challenges for the creation Free and open Indo-Pacific (FOIP), and the second session was dedicated to the Black Sea Region and security challenges there.

The speakers reviewed Japanese foreign policy vectors, interests, and recent cooperation tendencies towards Georgia, Caucasus, and GUAM countries in general, special attention was given to the Japanese initiative of creating FOIP.

The second part of the discussion was dedicated to the Black Sea Region and existing security actors in there, their geopolitical and economic interests, aims and objectives, and also, to the changing configurations of the balance of power in the region. The speakers also referred to the possibilities of the involvement of Japan in the Black Sea Security issues.

The professor of the Keio University, Ms. Ioko Hirose was participating in the event as a guest speaker. Besides, Mr. Tomohiko Uyama, a Professor at Hokkaido University, participated in the discussion in a distance regime.

The public discussion was organized with the joint efforts of Rondeli Foundation and the Embassy of Japan in Georgia.
