< CAMBODIA >

Mr. TONG Terang is the Director of the ASEAN Plus Three (APT), East Asia Summit (EAS) Department, General Department of ASEAN, and MFAIC. He graduated from the Faculty of Economic Science at the Royal University of Law and Economics (RULE) in 2013, and from the Faculty of International Relations at the Pannasastra University of Cambodia (PUC) in 2017. Joined the MFAIC in 2015. From 2015 to 2018, he was in charge of works related to the ASEAN Economic Community (AEC) and ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community (ASCC). Since 2018 to Present, serving in the ASEAN Plus Three (APT) and East Asia Summit (EAS) Department. The NEAT operates under the APT mechanism, and have participated in its activities, including the NEAT Working Group (NEAT-WG) and NEAT Country Coordinators’ Meeting (NEAT-CCM), from 2023 to the present.

Dr. Cuiling Zhang is the Senior Research Fellow and Division Chief of the International Cooperation Department at the China Population and Development Research Center. She serves as Council Member of the Chinese Population Association, Council Member of the Global Health Branch of the Chinese Health Economics Association, and Panel Member of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (IUSSP). She received her M.A. in Sociology from the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences in 2005 and her Ph.D. in Social Demography from Jilin University in 2019. She has been with the China Population and Development Research Center since 2005, and was a visiting scholar at the Cario Demographic Center (2007), Vienna Institute of Demography (2017) and the Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research (2019). Her research examines family transition, gender equity, demographic dynamics, and policy responses to population ageing in China. In recent years, she has led national and ministerial research projects on maternity and childbirth support, as well as on integrated care for the elderly and community-based care models. She has authored over 20 peer-reviewed articles in journals including BMJ Global Health, BMJ Open, and Population Research.

Dr. Shofwan Al Banna Choiruzzad is an Associate Professor at the Department of International Relations, Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Universitas Indonesia. He also serves as the Executive Secretary of the University’s ASEAN Study Center. and Masters and Ph.D. degrees from Graduate School of International Relations, Ritsumeikan University, Japan. His works have appeared in various academic and popular platforms, including Review of International Political Economy, Asia Europe Journal, Asian Perspective, Pacific Affairs, Contemporary Southeast Asia, Forest Policy and Economics, Asian Politics & Policy, Indonesia, Good Governance Africa, Global, Nikkei Asia, The Jakarta Post, Kompas, and Media Indonesia, among others. Dr. ONO Taichi is the Vice President, Professor, and Director of the Executive Development Center for Global Leadership at the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS), Japan. He joined the Ministry of Health and Welfare (now the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare) in 1989 and has held a number of senior positions in the fields of social security, healthcare, and long-term care policy. His previous appointments include First Secretary at the Embassy of Japan in the United States, Director of the Long-term Care Insurance Division of Hyogo Prefecture, Director of the Planning and Research Office for Health Insurance at the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare, Professor at the University of Tokyo Graduate School of Public Policy, Director of the Planning Department at the National Institute of Population and Social Security Research, and Senior Social Security Research Officer at the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare. His research focuses on social security policy, healthcare systems, long-term care, and policy responses to population ageing. He has published extensively on health systems, long-term care systems, and international comparisons of social security policies, including comparative studies of healthcare systems in East Asia.

Dr. IGARASHI Kumiko is Research Managing Director at the National Institute of Public Health (NIPH), Japan. She received her Ph.D. in Medical Science from Niigata University in 2010 and subsequently joined the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (MHLW). During her service at the Ministry she contributed to the development of policies on health and long-term care workforce development, global health, health emergency preparedness, and infectious disease control. She also participated in the Japanese government's response to the COVID-19 pandemic through the Cabinet Secretariat. While serving in the International Affairs Division of the MHLW, she led policy initiatives on healthy and active ageing, launched cooperation programmes with ASEAN Member States, and promoted policy dialogue through the ASEAN-Japan High-Level Officials Meeting on Caring Societies. Her current research focuses on policy and systems for achieving Universal Health Coverage (UHC) in ageing societies,
